Hive 2 – Vic

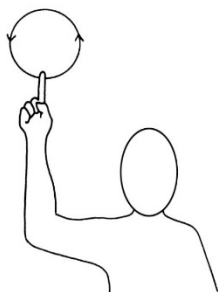
