The pupil cohort at Newstead is varied in the range of abilities and readiness for learning. Those at the pre-formal level will engage with history mainly through the understanding the world element of the EYFS curriculum although other elements of that will feature some historical elements. Those that are semi-formal learners will experience some parts of the EYFS approach and will begin to experience elements of the Cornerstones curriculum which aims to teach a skills and knowledge through a topic based approach. Our formal learners will follow the Cornerstones curriculum as a foundation although class teachers will have adapted and modified the learning to reflect the needs of their own classed

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Impact - how we will know we have achieved our aims:

Assessment is used to monitor progress and to help teachers adapt and plan lessons that provide challenge for the children

Pupil Voice reflects enthusiasm history. Pupils will be enthusiastic for history lessons and engagement will be clearly seen Planning follows our chosen curriculum pathways and provides challenge for all with adaptations made to meet the needs of our learners.

History will be reflected across the curriculum, from PHSE to assemblys eg Black History month, Holocaust Memorial day.
