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News from Our Hives

Simon's Hive

We've had a busy and exciting half term of learning so far.

In maths, the children have been exploring negative numbers and working with metric units of measurement. They've impressed us with their growing confidence and enthusiasm, especially when applying these skills in real-life contexts.

In writing, we've been travelling back in time to ancient Rome, creating descriptive pieces based on "A Day in Pompeii." The children used powerful vocabulary and vivid imagery to imagine what life was like just before the eruption of Mount Vesuvius.

Our topic lessons have taken us deep beneath the waves into the Blue Abyss, learning all about the wonders of the ocean. We've explored marine creatures, underwater habitats, and the importance of looking after our seas. We have also looked at the zones of the ocean, from the Sunlight Layer at the top to the Mariana Trench at the bottom.

Lewis's Hive

This month, we have been busy with lots of hands-on learning!

In maths, we've been exploring measurement using practical activities with scales and concrete objects. We've measured using non-standard units and learned about volume by investigating water and sand—helping us understand the concepts of full, half full, and empty. We've also been learning how to use a ruler to measure objects accurately. In our topic lessons, we've been discovering the Big Wide World! We've explored maps and globes, and learned about different climates around the world through fun, practical experiences. One of our favourite activities was creating our own map using cards to build roads and adding landmarks like our school and key places in Barnsley. It's been a fantastic half term so far full of curiosity, creativity, and discovery!
